Setting affects the selection

How can a story's setting affect plot?

It can function as a character, giving the other characters something to strive against or helping them out. It can also affect the mood and atmosphere of the plot.

How does setting affect theme?

How can imagery affect the setting in the story?

Imagery affects the setting in the story by setting the tone and keeping the attention of the reader. Describing in detail the author's ideas they want to convey can set a vision in the reader's mind of where the story is going and the overall attitude of the story.

How does a person in the story affect the plot?

How does perspective affect the plot of the story?
